#### Current Professional Role

I am the Chief Administrative Officer (City Manager) for the City of Selkirk (10,278 pop.) Beginning in 2014, I led the establishment of Selkirk's AM program, wrote our asset management strategy, program framework, and bylaw. I now participate on our AM team and guide the program's ongoing development. Reporting to council, I am accountable for all aspects of the city's operations. This includes the integration of asset management into all city service delivery, business planning systems and innovative initiatives such as our Tereo Award winning Climate Change Adaptation Strategy.

I am chair of the Association of Manitoba Municipalities' Asset Management Leadership Committee and led the development and oversight of AMM's MAMP Phase 1 project. I am currently working with AMM to evolve the committee into a Manitoba community of practice. I serve on FCM's AM Technical Working Group and am past chair of the AM Canada alliance. I have spoken about our AM program and how we are using asset management to become climate resilient at numerous conferences, seminars, and workshops.
